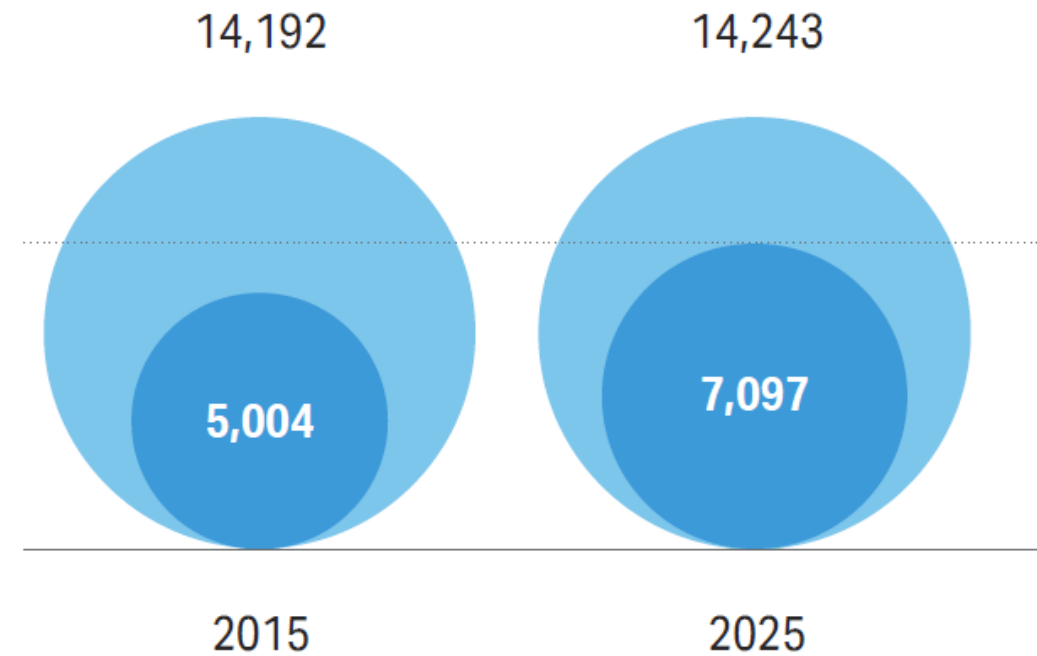

- 7,097 public school graduates in the Class of 2025 scored a 3 or higher on an AP Exam. This is an increase of 41.8% from 2015.

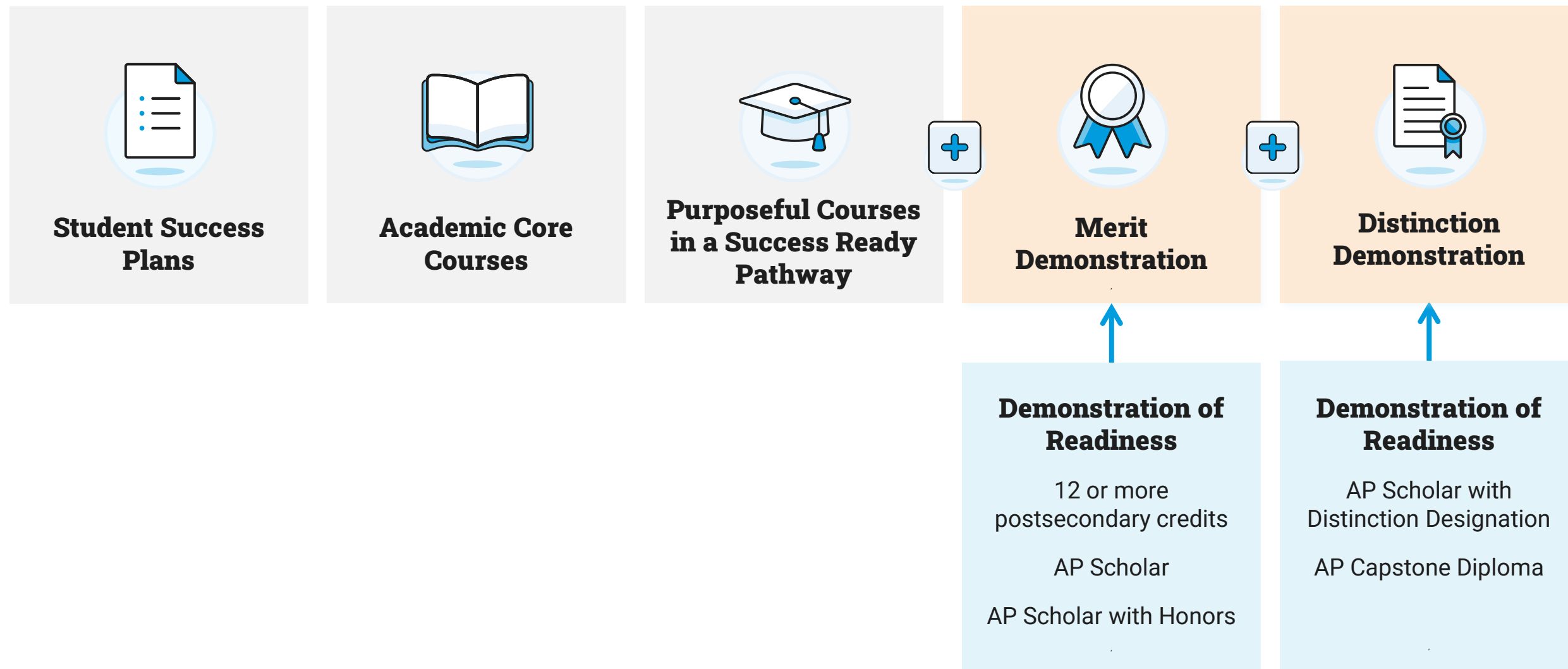

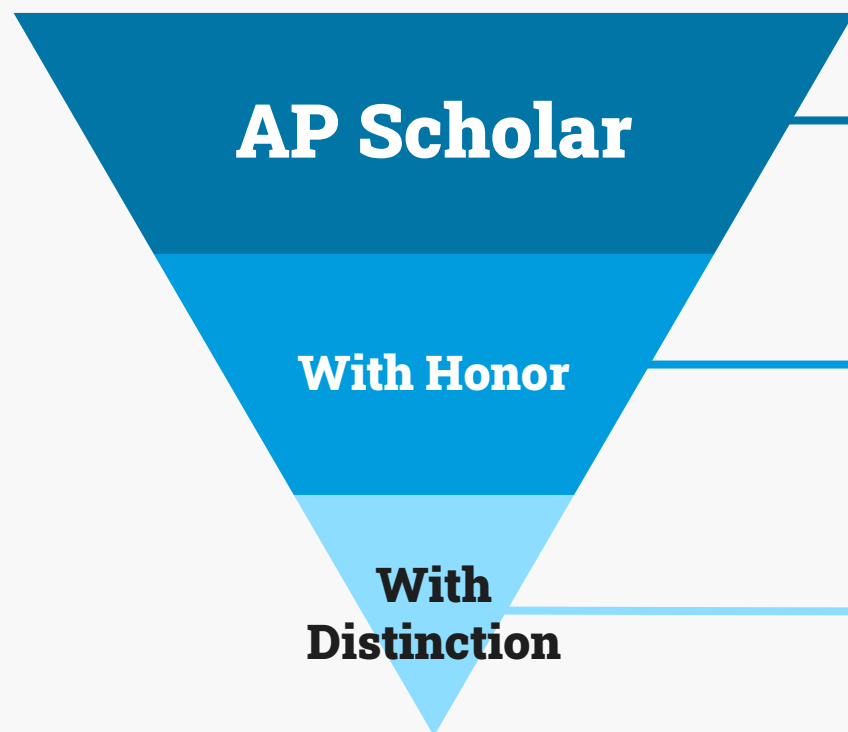

How to Earn AP Scholar Awards



AP Scholar Criteria

Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

AP Scholar with Honor Criteria

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, **and** scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

AP Scholar with Distinction Criteria

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, **and** scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

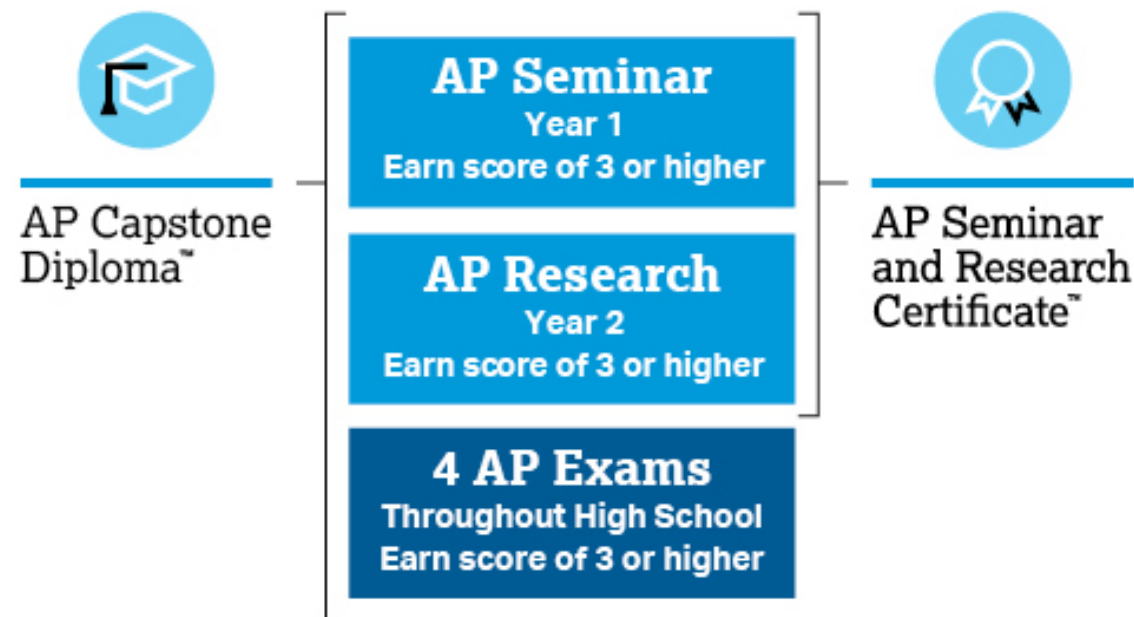

How to Earn AP Capstone Awards

AP Capstone Awards are listed on AP score reports, and students who earn the diploma or certificate can view and print their award certificate from their online account.

Awards are also included on any AP score report sent to colleges.

- **The AP Seminar and Research Certificate** is granted to students who earn scores of 3 or higher in both AP Seminar and AP Research.
- **The AP Capstone Diploma** is granted to students who earn scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing.

Scenario 1C: Impacts of Using Public Wi-Fi

You bring your friend to your favorite local coffee shop, Sunshine Coffee, to study. Your friend joins a free Wi-Fi network and logs in to a streaming music application. Your device connects automatically to the coffee shop's Wi-Fi network because you have been there before.

After a few minutes, your friend's music stops playing and they realize they are no longer logged in to their streaming music application. When they try to log back in, the application says their password is invalid.

You ask your friend to check which Wi-Fi network they joined and see that they connected to an unprotected network called "Sunshine Wi-Fi." However, the coffee

Students get real-world, experiences with authentic cybersecurity scenarios.

Work-based scenarios include:

- Conduct a physical vulnerability assessment of a new lab.
- Recommend and diagram a set of security features for three LANs on a naval submarine.
- Assess the risk from possible vulnerabilities of internet-connected farm equipment.
- Set access to proprietary research and development on an air-gapped computer.

AP Networking Exam

The AP Networking Exam will assess essential technical skills in computer networking and information technology.

- The exam will put students in the position of a network technician or administrator, leveraging career-connected scenarios to test their skills and their ability to make evidence-based, contextually aware decisions.

The digital exam will be divided into two sections:

- **Multiple Choice:** Questions will be based on networking scenarios.
- **Free Response:** Questions will use realistic networking artifacts and evidence for students to analyze and provide responses.

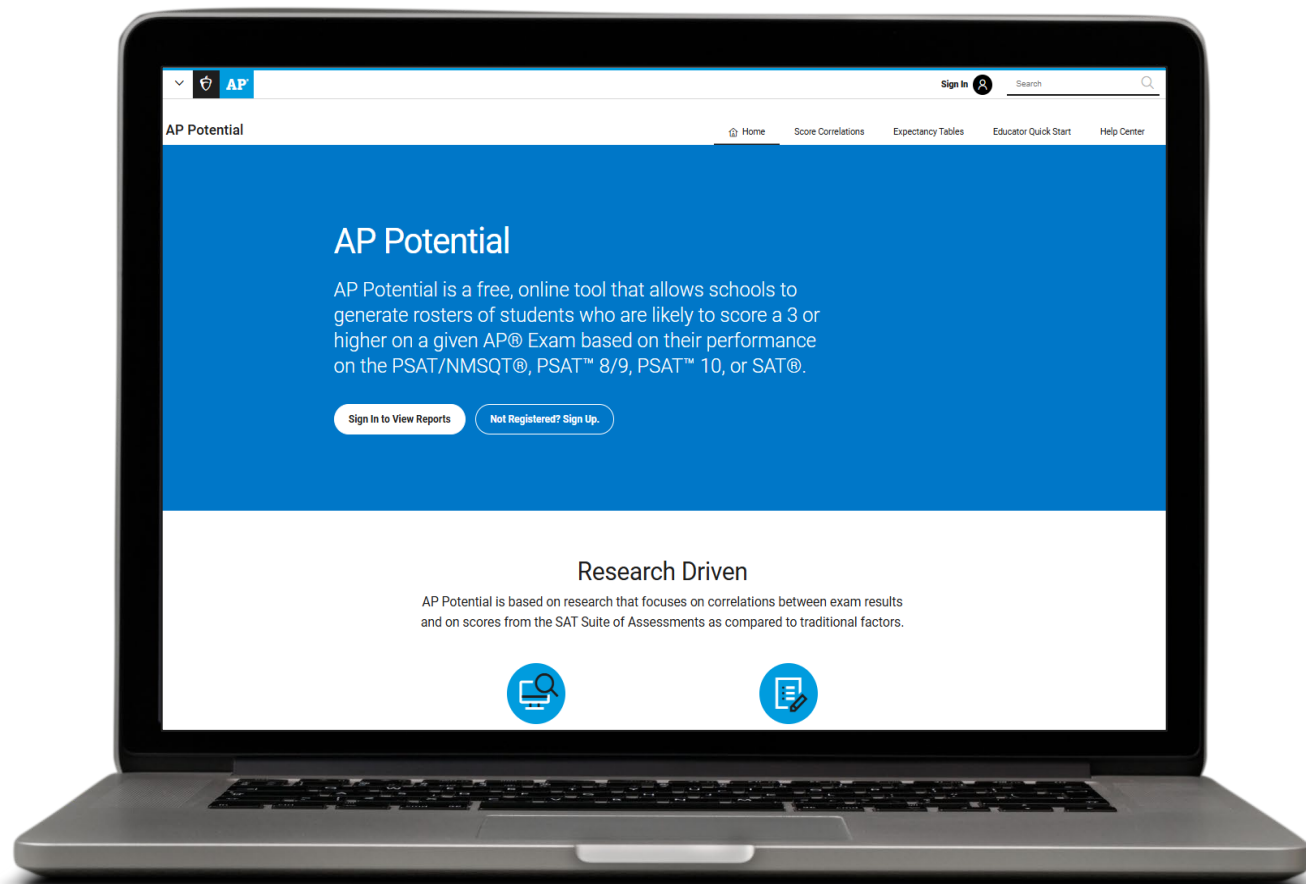
- **Columbia University's Teachers College Accelerated Learning in TX Study (2025) Findings:**
 - "Combining AP with dual enrollment was associated with higher postsecondary outcomes, particularly for bachelor's degree completion."
- **Indiana Commission for Higher Education's Indiana Early College Credit Report (2021) Findings:**
 - "High school students who take both AP and dual credit are more likely to enroll and succeed in college than AP or dual enrollment offerings alone."

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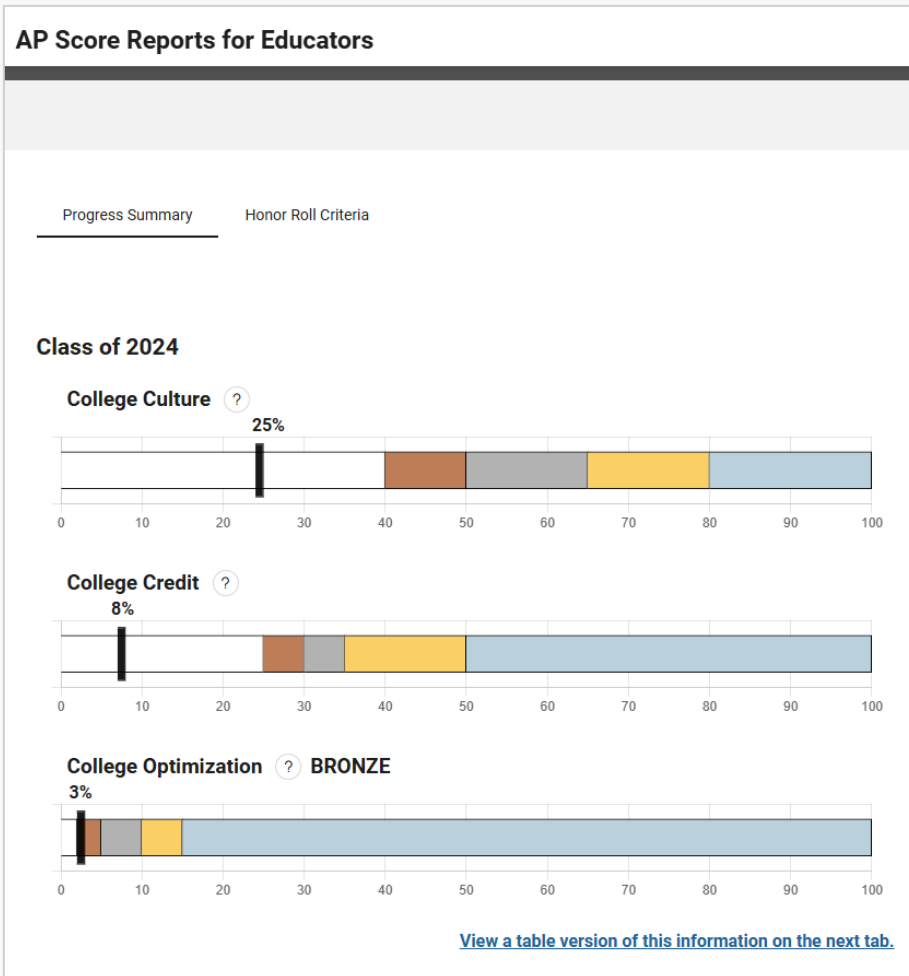

- Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results for students while broadening participation.

Report Metrics:

- **College Culture:** 40% or more of the graduating cohort took at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
- **College Credit:** 25% or more of the graduating cohort scored a 3 or higher on at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
- **College Optimization:** 2% or more of the graduating cohort took 5 or more AP Exams during high school.
 - *At least 1 of those exams was taken in 9th or 10th grade, so that students are spreading their AP experience across grades rather than feeling disproportionate pressure in any single year.*
