# Indicator 1 - Graduation

Indicator 1 - % of youth with IEP's graduating with a regular diploma.

## FFY 2024 SPP/APR Data

Number of youth with IEP's who exited special education: **4546**

Number of youth with IEP's who Exited with a regular diploma: **3833**

FFY 2024 Target: **83.7%**

FFY 2024 Actual: **84.32%**



# Indicator 2 –Drop Out

Indicator 2 - % of youth with IEP's dropping out.

FFY 2024 SPP/APR Data

Number of youth with IEP's who exited special education: 4546

Number of youth with IEP's who exited due to dropping out: 681

FFY 2024 Target: 15.54%

FFY 2024 Actual: 14.98%



# Indicator 13 – Secondary Transition

Indicator 13 - % of youth with IEP's who have appropriate measurable postsecondary goals.

FFY 2023 SPP/APR Data

FFY 2024 Target: 100%

FFY 2024 Actual: 98.85%

New Baseline coming, target remains 100%, still a compliance indicator.

# Indicator 14 – Post School Outcomes

Indicator 14 - % of youth with IEP's (A) enrolled in higher education, (B) Enrolled in higher education or competitively employed, (C) enrolled in higher ed or other training, competitively employed or other employment within one year of exit from high school.

Number of youth with IEP's who exited special education: **4374**

# Kansas 2025 Census Results

Response Rate for Opt-in Districts – 101 districts 1,474 Students in Census

Number of Respondents – 781

Total Response Rate – 52.99%

Response Rate for all other districts – 175 districts, 3,199 Students in Census

Number of Respondents – 361

Total Response Rate – 11.28%

# Step #1: Getting to Better Response Rates

## #1 Communicate

Make sure that Parents and Students know they will be contacted in June of the year following graduation or exit from school. Disseminate this info at IEP meetings, SOP review, in newsletters, on social media etc. Communicate early. Communicate often



# Step #2: Getting to Better Response Rates

## #2 Verify Contact Info Thoroughly

Make sure you have valid contact info for student and parents. Last year we had over 400 students in the census with no valid contact info. Over 200 students had no contact info at all. Verify contact info through 1) Post School Outcomes Web Application, 2) through your IEP system, 3) through your SIS.



# Step #3: Getting to Better Response Rates

#3 Test your contact info!

Great opportunity to inform students/parents of upcoming interviews as you verify contact info is accurate.
