What We Need from LEAs

- In order for LEAs to have access to real time data, each district has their own unique link. This means LEAs will be required to pull the link from District Tools and insert it into the letter for each district.
 - If you plan to print the letters for parents, we recommend downloading the QR code that parents can scan.
- If parents don't have access to internet/devices, try to provide access to them if possible.



Title IA and ESEA

- All districts in Kansas will be required to administer the Kansas Family Engagement Survey—Version 2 (FES-2) in SY 26-27
 - Inform district and building leaders about the success at engaging parents in the education of all children
 - Access to the evaluation data at the district and building level
 - Support work within the district across all programs (ESEA and IDEA)
 - Meet the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education (OESE) Parent and Family Engagement Requirements
 - Removes need to upload documentation within KansaStar and the KIAS ESEA Consolidated Review
 - Technical Assistance to be provided through KSDE
- Title IA and ESEA Parent and Family Engagement Training coming in July and again in August — for all persons working with a Title IA program — school-wide and targeted assistance. District level and Building level training will be offered
 - Information about trainings will be communicated out via the LCP listserv, Title IA contact list, and available on the KSDE Website
