On 2/16/2026, Detective Sgt. Sam Winchester requested my assistance with the forensic examination of digital evidence devices in a cold case homicide investigation. These devices were seized during the execution of a search warrant at the suspect's residence, 5148 Louise Ave. in Edmond, Oklahoma on 10/16/2021. Det. Winchester provided a signed, Oklahoma County search warrant for the forensic examination of a Dell Optiplex 390 computer (HD001) and an Apple iPhone 5c (Cell001). This investigation began on 10/4/2021 at 1731 hours when Edmond Police Department received a 911 call reporting the victim, Jessica Pratt, had been found unresponsive in the backyard of her residence by her husband, William Pratt. According to the search warrant affidavit, surveillance footage recorded by the Ring doorbell camera across the street from the victim's residence show a white Kia Soul with Oklahoma license plate XLY269 stopping in front of 1627 Revello Dr. on 10/4/2021 at 0903 hours, which is the residence across the street from the victim's home. Further investigation determined the vehicle was registered to Thomas Wayne Harris. During an interview with Mr. Harris, he stated he was a driver for a rideshare application named 99 Private Driver and Taxi App. He went on to state he picked up a customer by the name of Willow Rosenboom that morning and admitted to dropping her off at that location. He describes Willow as a petite, blonde wearing a white t-shirt and jeans. He was able to provide a receipt confirming this information and a subsequent receipt showing he left the area to immediately pick up his next customer. According to Det. Winchester, Willow Rosenboom is a business partner of Green Queens dispensary with the victim. Early examination of the victim's cell phone show text exchanges between a phone number identified as Ms. Rosenbloom's and the victim arguing about money. In this text exchange, these individuals agreed to meet at approximately 0900 on 10/4/2021. Additionally, Det. Winchester advised there was a history of domestic violence between the victim and her husband, Mr. William Pratt. He also advised that Willow Rosenbloom's father was identified as Mitchell Luciano, the head of a well-known organized crime family.

Digital Crime Lab Examinations

A forensic image of the data contained on the hard drive removed from the Dell Optiplex 390 computer was created using AccessData® FTK® Imager version 4.5.0.3. This

forensic image was then processed using Magnet Axion version 9.10.1.47349. In regard to the cell phone in this case, Cellebrite UFED 4PC version 7.76.0.24 was used to complete extractions of the data contained on each cell phone. Then Physical Analyzer version 10.4.1.2071 was used to examine the extracted data from the cell phones. Only the items determined to be of evidentiary value in this investigation will be discussed in this report.

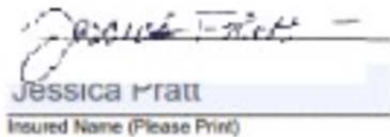

Upon examination of the Willow user profile on this device, several items of interest in this investigation were observed. Analysis of the Google searches under the Willow user profile shows the user searched things like “being a good business partner” and “can my business partner push me out” on 8/20/2019 5:31:59 PM and 12/18/2020 8:48:36 PM (UTC), respectively. These dates are approximately a year before the death of Jessica Pratt. Additional Google searches on or around the time of the homicide the user under the Willow user profile searched for “can blood be washed out of clothes,” “can DNA be found of blood can’t be seen,” and “how to get away with murder.” Furthermore, there are Google Chrome records showing the Gmail inbox for willowrosenbloom@gmail.com is being accessed under the Willow user profile on more than one occasion. Since this is a web-based email account, the content of this inbox cannot be seen on this computer. An additional search warrant to Google for this email account would be necessary for this information to be obtained.

Pictures under the Willow user profile also show a “Permission to Enroll/Audit Form” for the University of Central Oklahoma’s Jackson College of Graduate Studies,

where Mrs. Pratt was a student, appearing to have been filled out by Mrs. Pratt. This form includes her name, student ID number, and her signature. There are also picture files of Mrs. Pratt's signature that have been taken from this document. Analysis of the file path of these pictures show they were being edited using Microsoft Paint software, which is shown to be installed on this computer and last used on 10/4/2021. Furthermore, the lnk files show the files named "Jessica Signature" and "Jessica Signature edited.png" were saved to the folder Users\Willow\Pictures. It is important to understand that a lnk file is a shortcut created by the system as a way of speeding up the system after a file has been opened at least one time. Therefore, a lnk file cannot exist unless a user has accessed a file. Since this file is no longer found in this folder, the user had to have deleted it after it was accessed on 1/30/2020. Additionally, there was a thumbnail of a Notice and Consent Form for Life Insurance file containing Jessica Pratt's signature naming Willow Rosenbloom as the policyholder. Upon closer inspection of the signature line, it appears the signature has been copied and pasted into the document rather than signed. This is evidenced by the fact that the line below it, where the name Jessica Pratt appears, has been partially covered by a white box around the signature. This can be seen in the picture below.



The unsigned version of this form was also found under the Willow user profile in the Documents folder under the filename "Life Insurance Form Fillable.pdf." The lnk files also indicate the user accessed this file and a picture file of the same name indicating a pdf document and a png picture file of this document also existed on this computer at one time. Lnk files created on 1/30/2020 also show two (2) pictures with the filenames IMG_0001.jpg and IMG_0002.jpg were accessed in the Pictures/Camera Roll folder. This indicates pictures were saved from a cell phone to this folder. Since these pictures are no longer in the folder, the user deleted them at some point after accessing them on 1/30/2020. Because of their deleted status, there is no way to know what these photos contained.

It is also important to know that an Apple iPhone was listed under the connected devices on this computer. The serial number for this iPhone was listed as a73f9edbe748df1fd23eda2866a44ccdb62a3722, which is consistent with the unique identifier on the Apple iPhone 5c (Cell001) discussed later in this report. In the connected device information it documents it was first connected on 1/30/2020. Recall this is the same date and time IMG_0001.jpg and IMG_0002.jpg were created in the Camera Roll folder. This could indicate the pictures were saved to this device from

Cell001. Furthermore, it was last connected to this computer on 10/4/2021, the day of the homicide.

After examination of the GreenQueens user profile several pictures of interest were discovered. These pictures are of a young, female of Asian descent consistent with the victim. In these pictures the female has many bruises and other injuries to her face. The metadata on these pictures show they were taken with an LGUS375 model camera. According to Phonescoop.com, an LGUS375 is identified as an LG K8 android cell phone. This is consistent with the cell phone found at the homicide scene which was identified as the victim's phone. This phone is also listed under the USB connected devices. This indicates the user last connected this cell phone on 8/28/2020 at 8:39:11 PM and saved these pictures from the cell phone to this computer.

During the analysis of the pictures on this computer, "kitty porn" was discovered. Since this type of evidence goes beyond the scope of the search warrant regarding the homicide investigation. All examinations were halted and Det. Winchester was contacted. He subsequently obtained an additional search warrant for the examination of evidence of child exploitation. There were sixteen (16) pictures containing "kitty porn." All of these pictures were saved under the William user profile in the Saved Pictures folder. The lnk files also indicate the user accessed them more than once. Additionally, there were Google searches for kitties and kitties and dogs under the William user profile indicating the user was searching for these types of pictures on the internet and then downloading them to be saved to this computer. Lastly, there were five (5) files matching the filenames of the "kitty porn" pictures in the Chrome Downloads under the William user profile on 1/27/2020 ranging from 9:17 PM (UTC) to 9:21 PM (UTC). There was also evidence of an email address, luverboypratt@gmail.com, for William Pratt being accessed on this device on the same day as the "kitty porn" downloads. Since this is a web-based email account, the email content for this account is not saved to this device. An additional search warrant to Google for this account would be needed for this data to be retrieved. All of the artifacts discussed in this section of the report can be seen in the Axiom report provided to Det. Winchester.

The first relevant information was the Apple ID email address matching the email account also accessed on HD001. This indicates this email account was utilized and accessed on both devices. Additionally, William Pratt is listed in the top 5 messaging parties on this device. His phone number is listed as 405-266-2661 in the contacts. Furthermore, there is only one text message sent from this device to William Pratt. It states, "Hi, I'm using Dingtone now. Free calls, free messages! Download it from <http://dingtone.me/ios/fo/fs?i=dingtoneu3Dtrm>." This indicates the user is not using the native text messaging application on this phone for all texting communications. Upon further examination, Dingtone is listed under the installed applications on this device but none of the chats from this application are seen in the chat messages. However, there is a database file associated with this application indicating it is being used on this device. Examinations of this database show several text messages have been sent and received on this device. The same phone number for William Pratt is seen in this database communicating through Dingtone, as well as Dad. Below are the messages observed between this device, identified as 145138310104981, and two (2) other participants identified as 405-266-2661 and Dad (4053532132).

Observe the last two messages were exchanged on the day of the homicide. Additionally, there is an installed application named "OneTravel" with the database com.99taxi. This is associated with the application 99 Private Driver and Taxi application. Recall, this is the application utilized by Mr. Thomas Wayne Harris on the morning of the homicide to pick up and drop off a customer who he identified as

“Willow.” All the items discussed in this section can be seen in the Cellebrite report provided to Det. Winchester.

Report Summary

The examination of these devices show several items of evidentiary value in this case. The Dell Optiplex (HD001) contained three (3) different user profiles active on this device. The first user profile was named Willow. User activity under this profile show several Google searches of interest including “how to get away with murder,” “can blood be washed out of clothes,” and “can DNA be found of blood can't be seen.” Furthermore, there was data that indicated the user was attempting to forge an insurance policy for the victim, Jessica Pratt, with Willow Rosenbloom listed as the beneficiary. There was also evidence of the email address willowrosenbloom@gmail.com being used on this computer. The second user profile, GreenQueens, had several photos showing a woman of Asian descent with multiple facial injuries. These photos were taken with an LG model cell phone consistent with the victim’s phone and the victim’s husband, William Pratt, had a history of domestic violence against her. The third user profile, William, searched, downloaded, and saved several pictures of “kitty porn.” The email address luverboypratt@gmail.com was used under this user profile. Additional search warrants to Google are needed to obtain the data associated with both of these email accounts.

Cell002, an Apple iPhone 5c, was also analyzed in this case. It was also found to use the email account willowrosenbloom@gmail.com. The application used to pick up and drop off a customer on the morning of the homicide, 99 Private Driver and Taxi App, was installed on this device. Additionally, a texting application known as Dingtone was also installed. Examination of the database associated with this texting application show the user communicating with a phone number identified as William Pratt in the contacts about meeting up and their disdain for the victim. There were two (2) additional messages with a participant identified as “Dad” where the user states they have “messed up” and need their expert help. A message from “Dad” is received that simply says, “dont say anything else. im on my way”. Recall Willow Rosenbloom’s father is identified as Mitchell Luciano, head of a well-known organized crime family. All items discussed in this report can be seen in the Axiom and Cellebrite reports provided to Det. Winchester.
