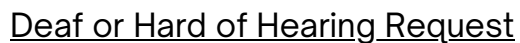

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Arkansas Behavior Support Specialists

The Arkansas Behavior Support Specialists (BSS) build local capacity by providing school teams with the support needed to implement evidence-based behavioral practices to meet the needs of all students. This is accomplished through job-embedded coaching, ongoing professional learning opportunities, and collaborative partnerships with school teams.

Behavior

- Team-based support
- Consultation and/or coaching for teams serving students with high need behaviors
- Consultation and/or coaching on Functional Behavior Assessment (FBA) and Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) development/revision
- Requires a completed Application for Customized Critical Behavior Supports
- If available, upload the following additional information and/or documents
 - Classroom behavior management plan
 - Prior **redacted** FBAs, BIPs, and/or Crisis Plans
 - Documentation of previously attended behavior trainings
 - **Redacted** data on previously tried interventions



Educational Services for the Visually Impaired

ESVI provides technical assistance and support to address educational and environmental barriers while promoting independence and meaningful access for students with visual impairments in the least restrictive environment. Visit www.esvi.org for more information.



Blind or Low Vision Request

- Student-specific support
- Requires a medical eye report and/or neurological report(s) dated within the last three (3) years



Arkansas Brain Injury School Support

The Arkansas Brain Injury School Support Program supports the needs of students with acquired brain injuries resulting from either traumatic (TBI) or non-traumatic such as tumors or stroke. Brain Injury Request

- Student-specific support
- Requires an IEP and evaluation report(s)
- If applicable, healthcare plan, neuropsychological evaluation, and medical report(s) should also be uploaded

Educational Support and Related Services Specialists

The Educational Support and Related Services Specialists (ESRSS) promote positive outcomes by providing leadership, support, and services to students with disabilities, their families, and the districts that serve them. ESRSS improves cohesion among educators and school-based therapists (OTs, PTs, and SLPs) by growing district capacity through professional learning and technical assistance. Educational Programming Request

- Team-based support
- Requires multiple documents, including the IEP, evaluation report(s), classroom schedule, and classroom observation

Psychoeducational Evaluation Support Request

- Team-based support
- Requires multiple documents, including the IEP, evaluation report(s), and applicable medical report(s)

Pediatric Feeding Disorders Request

- Team-based support
- Requires multiple documents, including the IEP, evaluation report(s), and feeding observation data
- If applicable, a healthcare plan, swallow study, and medical reports should also be uploaded

Assistive Technology Short-Term Loan Program

The Assistive Technology (AT) Loan Program provides public schools and public charter schools with short-term access to AT for students at no cost. Schools may borrow equipment to support student needs, evaluate potential solutions, or explore technology before making a purchase. Devices are delivered in-person or shipped directly to the school, and training or technical assistance is available upon request. Visit www.artasc-at4all.org to learn more.

Assistive Technology (AT) and AAC Request

- Team-based support
- AT including Assistive Technology for Augmentative/Alternative Communication (AAC)
- Requires specific documents, including the IEP, evaluation report(s), and AT or AAC data collection
