



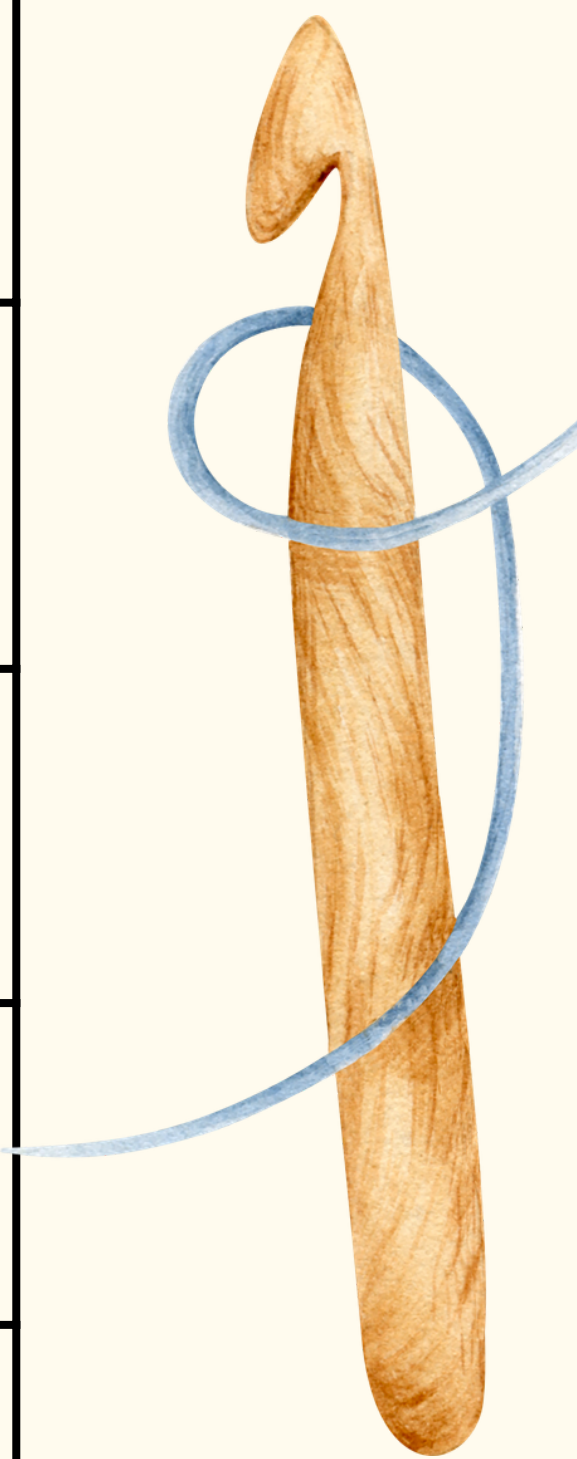

<i>Stitch Name</i>	<i>Abbreviation</i>	<i>What it Looks Like/When to Use</i>
<i>Slip Knot</i>	<i>–</i>	<i>The temporary loop that starts your project on the hook.</i>
<i>Chain Stitch</i>	<i>ch</i>	<i>The foundation row or the “turning chain” at the start of a new row.</i>
<i>Single Crochet</i>	<i>sc</i>	<i>A tight, sturdy stitch. Perfect for coasters, washcloths, and amigurumi.</i>
<i>Slip Stitch</i>	<i>sl st</i>	<i>Used to join pieces together, finish a round, or move yarn without adding height.</i>
<i>Fasten Off</i>	<i>fo</i>	<i>Cutting the yarn and pulling the tail through the last loop to secure it.</i>

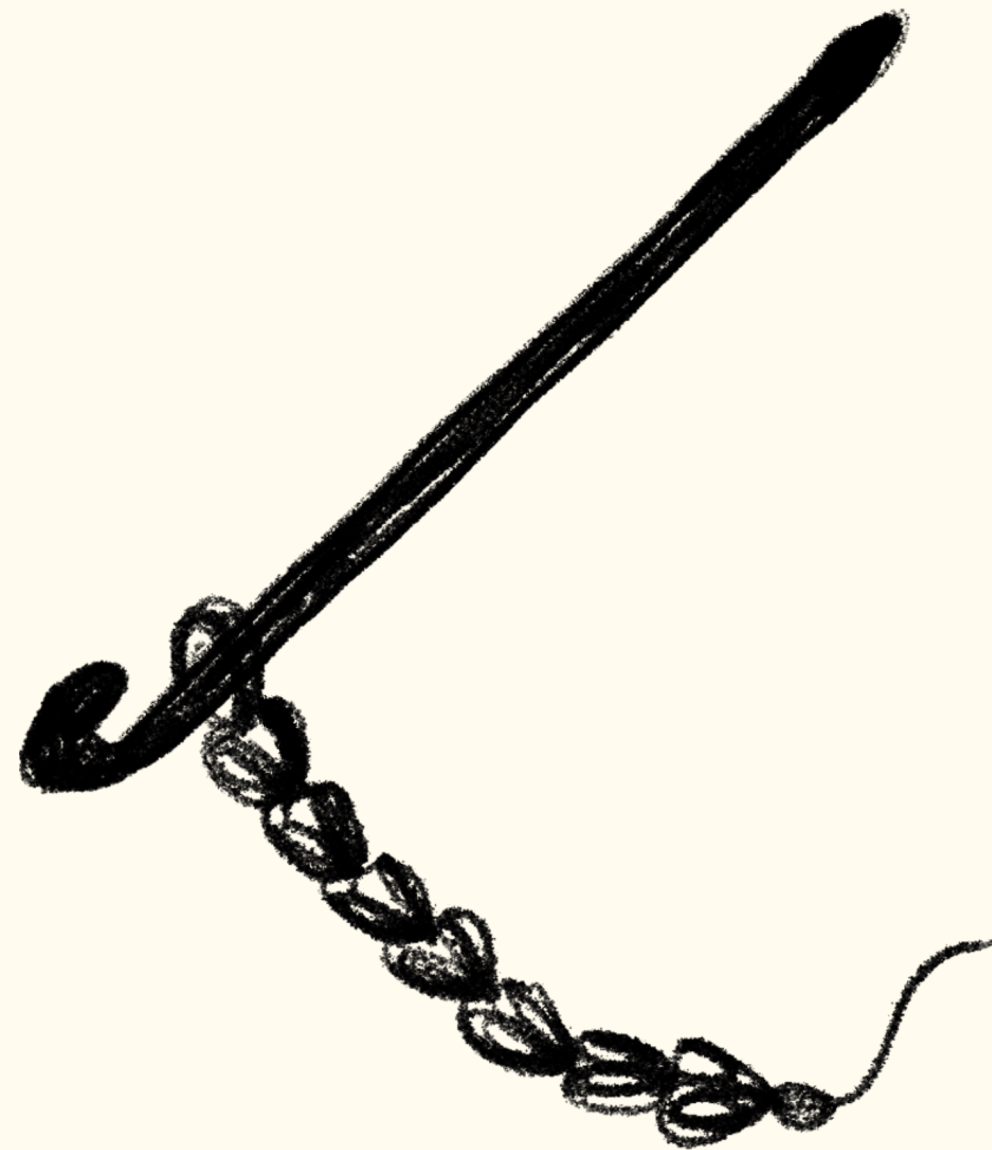


How to Read a Yarn Label



Square Coaster Crochet Pattern

Start by chaining 15

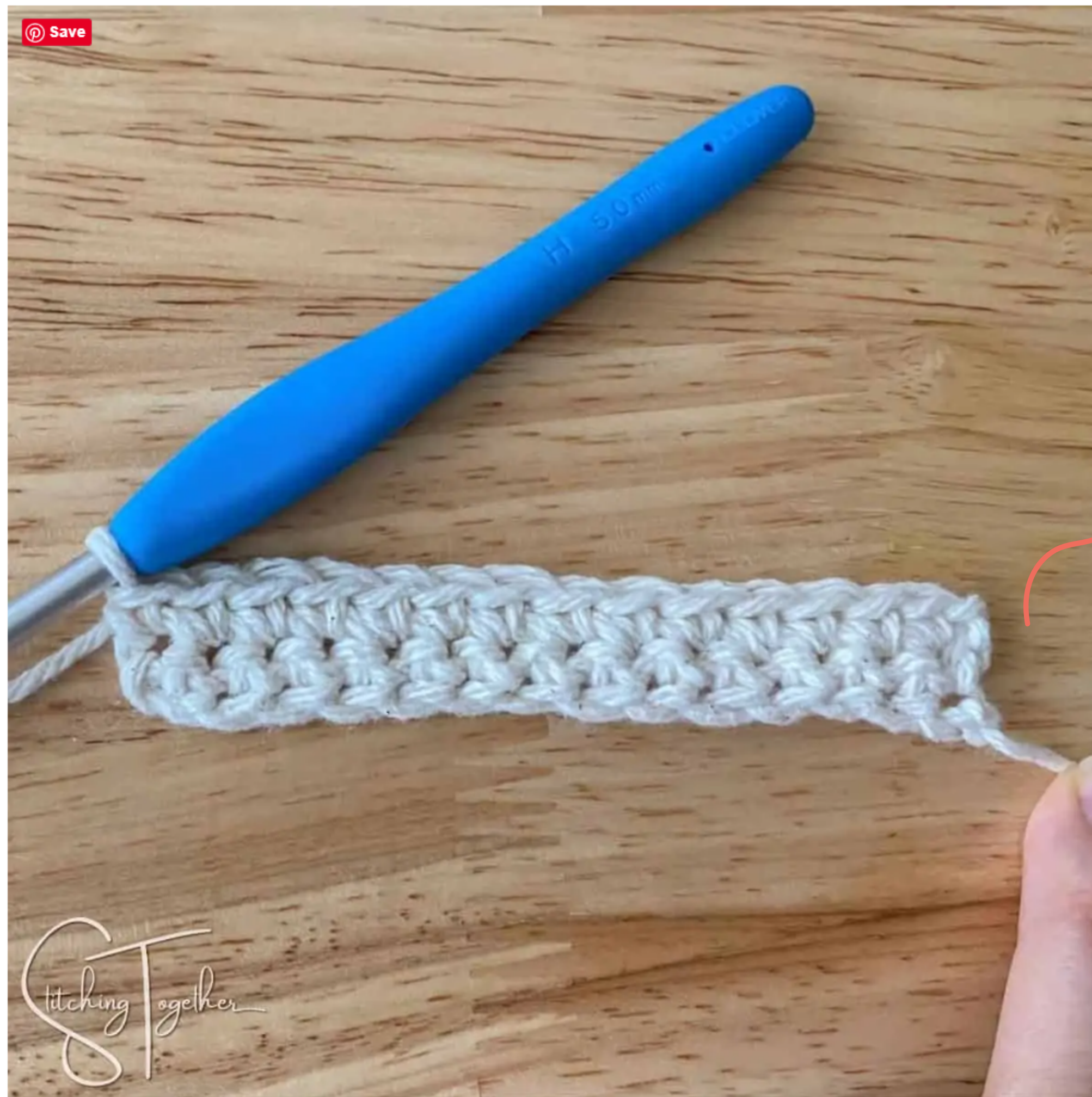




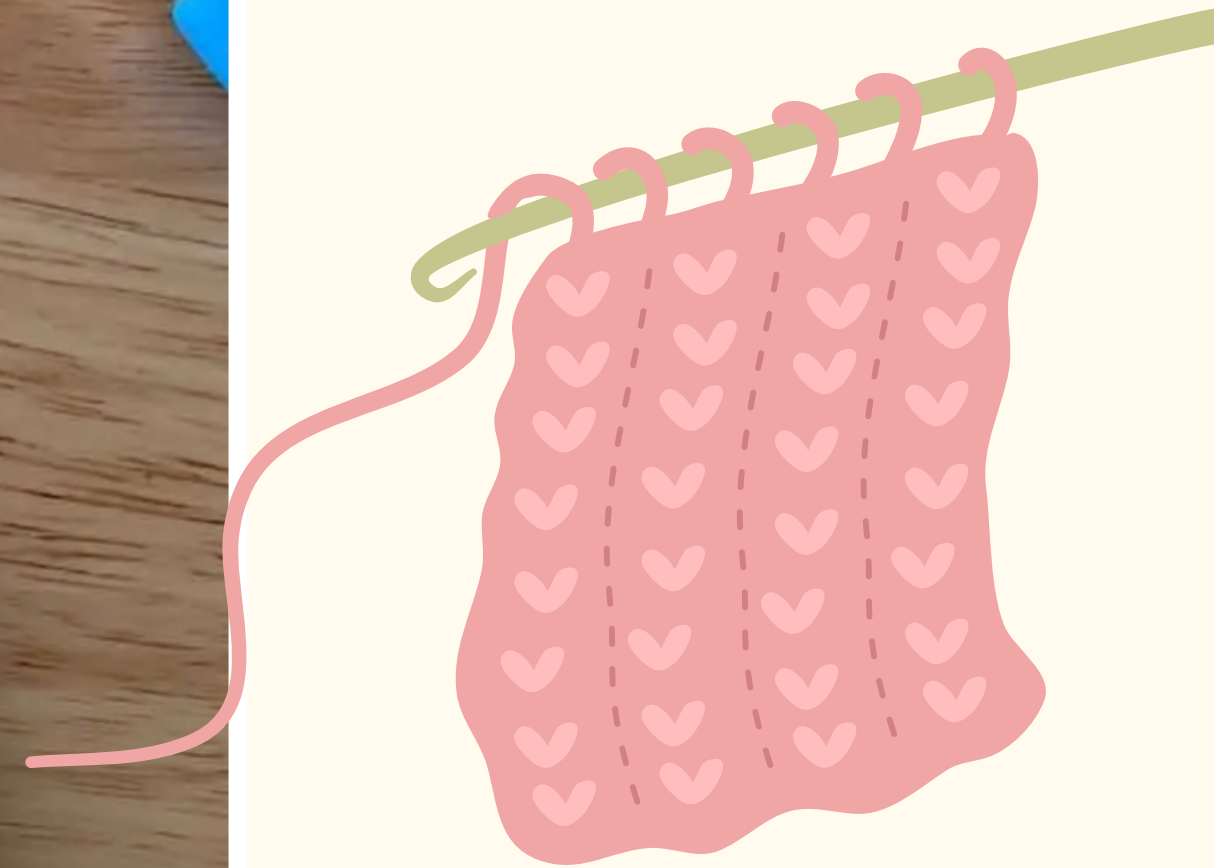
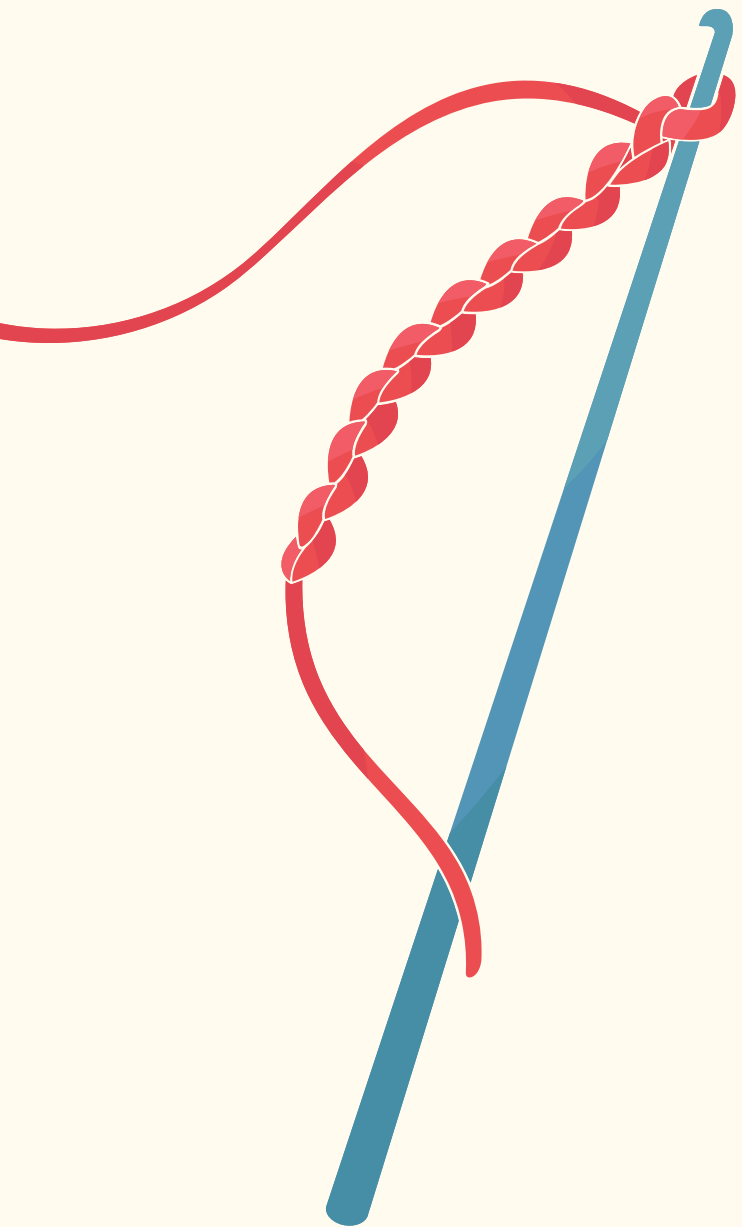
Row 1: single crochet in the 2nd chain from the hook and in each chain across.

You'll have 14
single crochets at
the end of row 1.
Turn.

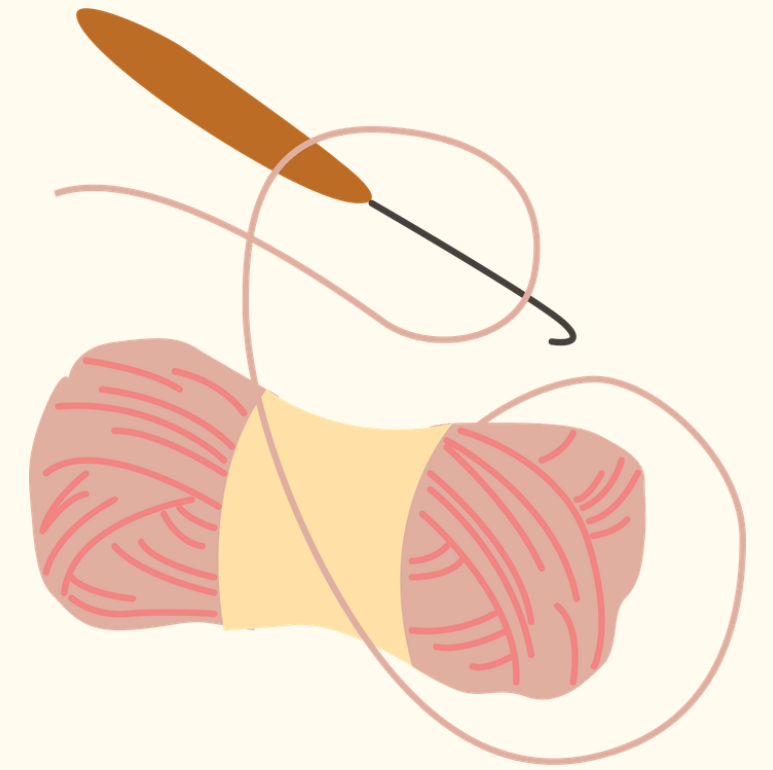
Row 2: Chain 1,
single crochet in
each stitch across.

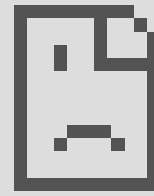


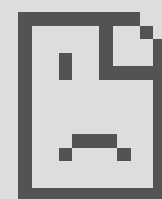
Row 3–16: Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 16 rows or you've made a square.



One of the ways I like to check for squareness is by folding my project in half diagonally to see how closely the sides line up.









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
