Current status

- The group is transitioning from open discussions to concrete straw proposals for key review components.
- Final recommendations are targeted for ICANN85, requiring rapid stakeholder input.
- The group has defined five distinct categories of review mechanisms (Buckets A-E).
- Feedback summaries for Continuous Improvement (B) and Structural Reviews (C) are complete.

Review framework (buckets)

Bucket	Topic	Notes
A	Participation and outcomes review	using Strategic Plan/Operating Plan assessments (every 5 years)
B	Continuous Improvement Process	lightweight, ongoing, SO/AC-directed self-assessments
C	Structural Reviews	comprehensive periodic assessments (every 10-12 years, with flexibility)
D	Review of Reviews	meta-assessment of review system effectiveness (every 10 years)
E	Ad Hoc Reviews	unforeseen circumstances, requires community-wide review (high threshold, on-demand)

Considerations for SSAC

- **Scope Definition:** Technical and security elements that should be in-scope or out-of-scope for structural reviews require SSAC input to prevent insufficient oversight or inappropriate interference.
- **Empowered Community Role:** The framework increasingly relies on empowered community mechanisms for review governance (initiating/preventing reviews, setting thresholds).
- **Technical Expertise Requirements:** Reviews must include appropriate technical expertise, particularly for external audits and structural assessments of security/stability functions.
- **Implementation Tracking:** Current gap in how security-related review recommendations will be tracked and enforced (previously ATRT function, now unassigned).

Empowered Community Factor

- **Structural Integration:** The new framework integrates EC mechanisms to initiate, guide, or set thresholds for reviews.
- **Current SSAC Status:** Unlike the ASO, ccNSO, GNSO, ALAC, and GAC, the SSAC does not currently hold "Decisional Participant" status.
- **Practical Impact:** Currently, the SSAC would not formally vote on whether structural reviews proceed or are modified.

Questions for SSAC (Input Needed)

- **Provide framework feedback ASAP**
- **Define Structural Scope:** What technical and security elements should be explicitly in-scope or out-of-scope for structural reviews?
- **Identify Ad Hoc Scenarios:** What specific technical/security scenarios might require Ad Hoc reviews, and what should the triggers/thresholds be?
- **Ensure Technical Expertise:** How do we best ensure external audits and structural assessments mandate appropriate technical expertise?
- **Evaluate the EC Question:** Review the detailed strategic analysis document. Does the SSAC need EC participation to fulfill its mission, or do the resource considerations outweigh the benefits?
