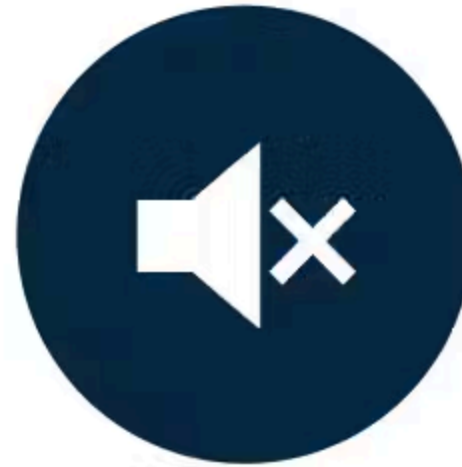

IMPACT

How directly does the action benefit ccTLD managers in addressing the identified theme?

EFFORT

What are the resources, coordination, and time required for IGLC to deliver the action?



IMPACT

Scoring guidance

- **Low impact**

the topic is relevant to a small subset of ccTLDs, or other groups (inside or outside ccNSO) are better placed to deliver.

- **Medium impact**

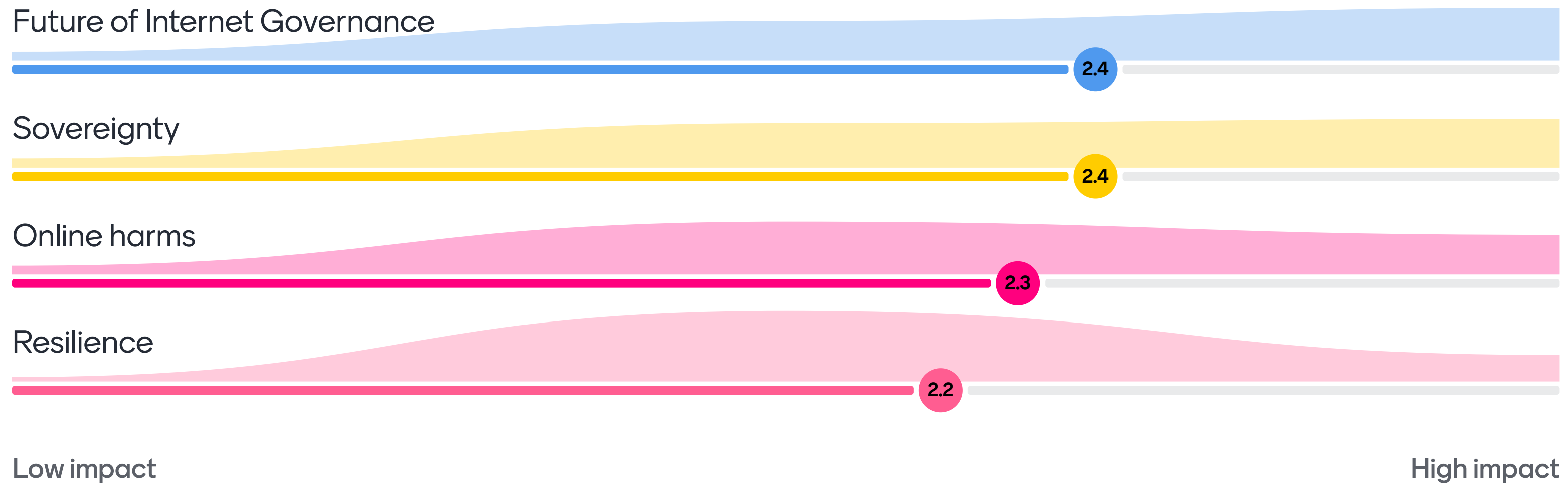
the topic is relevant to many ccTLDs but action is not urgent, or IGLC adds value primarily through awareness-raising rather than direct support.

- **High impact**

ccTLDs across regions face this issue now and need IGLC support to navigate it (e.g. new regulations naming DNS providers, active legislative processes, governance developments requiring ccTLD participation).

IMPACT

If IGLC delivers on this topic, how directly does it help ccTLD managers in your region respond to current and emerging challenges?



EFFORT

Scoring guidance

- **Low effort**

can be delivered through existing IGLC meeting structure, member contributions, and staff support (e.g. sharing updates, newsletter contributions, curating existing materials).

- **Medium effort**

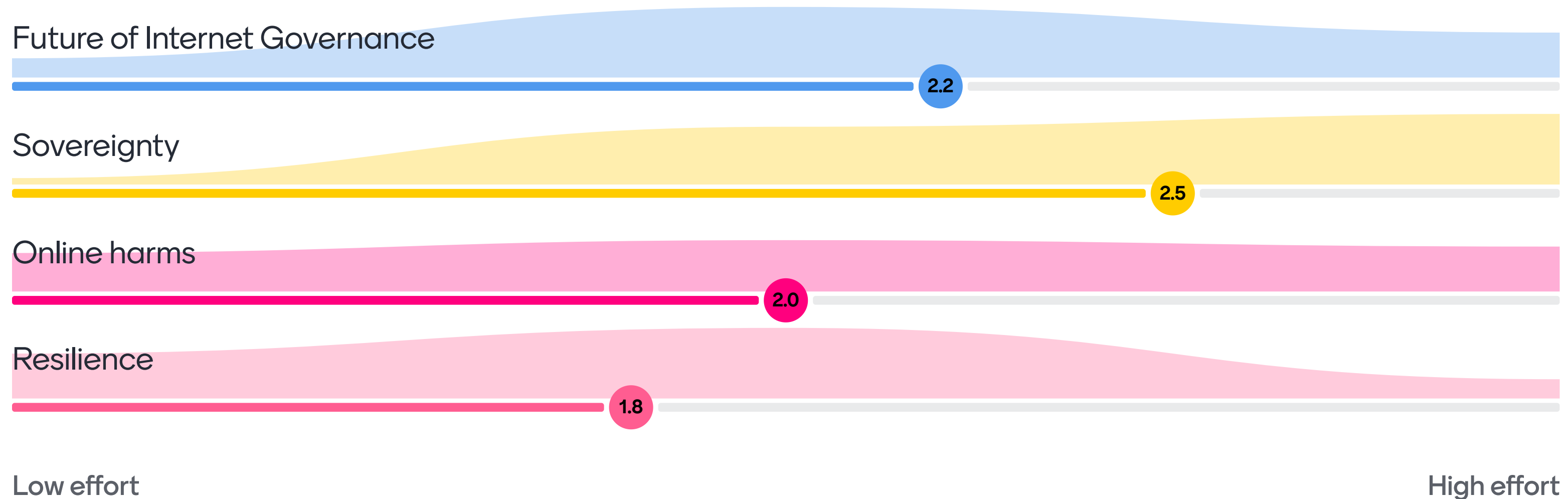
requires dedicated sessions, speaker coordination, document drafting, or cross-committee liaison (e.g. organizing panels, writing explainers, coordinating with GAC or TLD-OPS).

- **High effort**

requires new infrastructure, sustained multi-meeting workstreams, external partnerships, or technical development (e.g. building platforms, establishing ongoing monitoring programmes, joint statements requiring consensus).

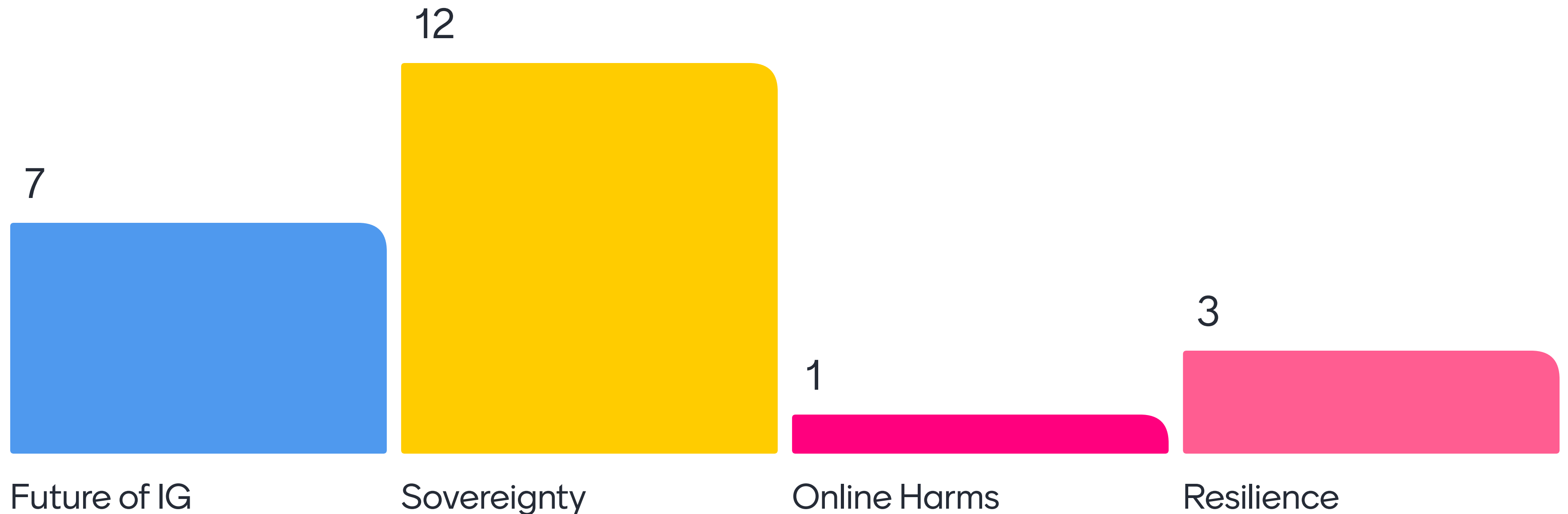
What resources, coordination, and sustained commitment does IGLC need to deliver meaningful results on this topic within the next 12 months?



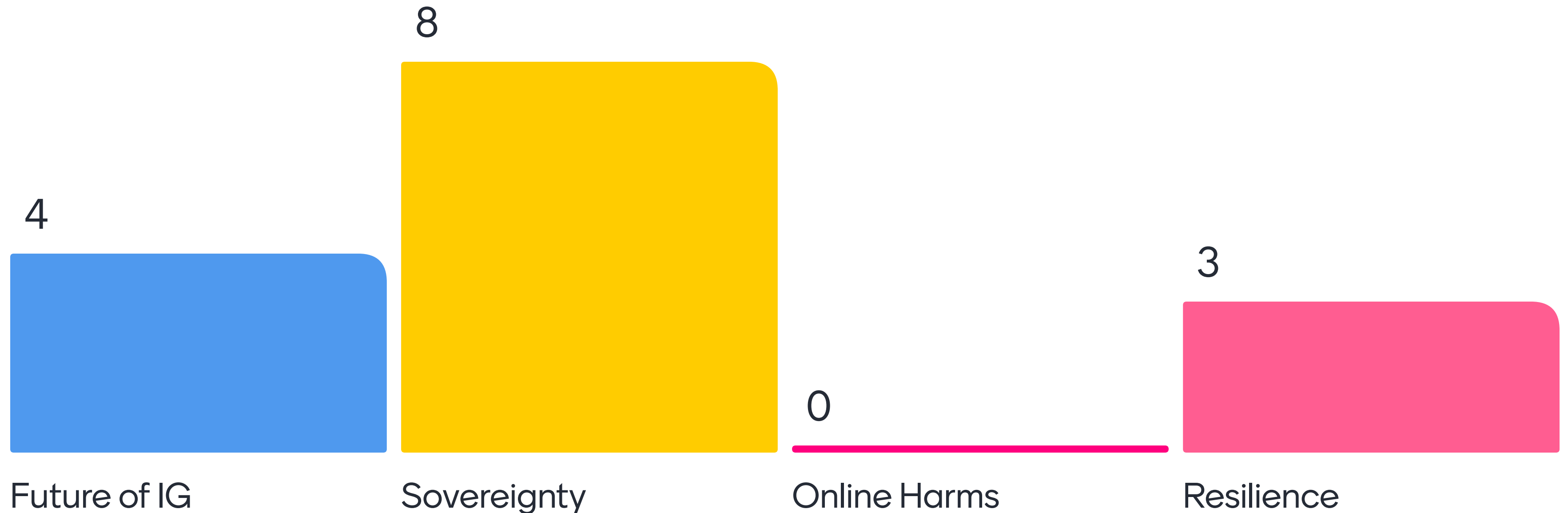
Prioritisation across all topics

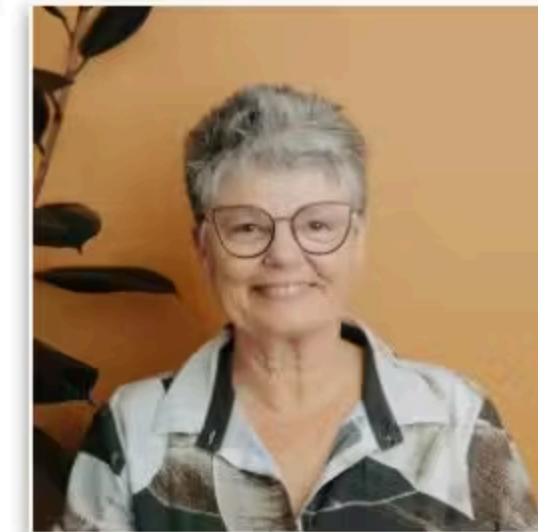
