



IDENTITY LAYER

Who MARVIN is. Personality, writing style, routing rules. Read once on startup, rarely changes.

CURRENT STATE

Bullets and short descriptions. Active goals, open threads, who matters right now. Updated throughout the day.


DAILY SESSIONS

The deep log. Everything that happened, every decision, every context shift. Current state points here for details.

WEEKLY REPORTS

Past weeks compressed into summaries. Sessions roll up into reports so old context stays accessible without bloating the window.

154   - "Here's the thing:" or "Here's what..."
155   - "The key insight:" or "The crucial instruction:"
156   - "It's worth noting that..."
157   - "Let me explain..."
158   - "The key is to..."
159   - "But here's what [role] sees:"
160 - **Just say it directly.** Instead of "The crucial instruction:" just write the instruction. Instead of "Here's the thing:" just state the thing.
161 - Keep tone casual and conversational for personal emails
