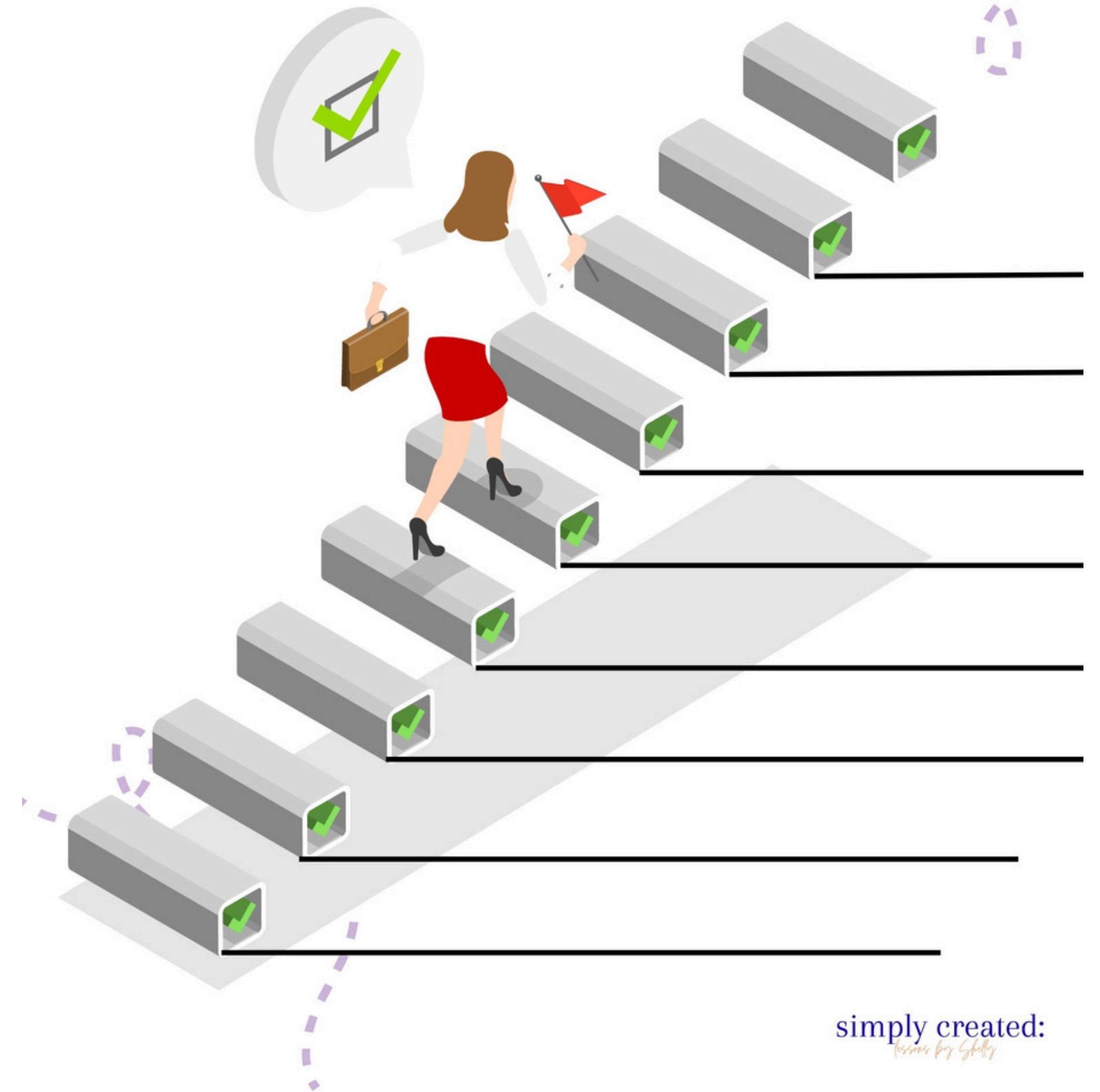


EDUCATIONAL LADDER

- The educational ladder is a straightforward way to show the level of education required for different career paths.
- Each step on the educational ladder represents a different level of education.
- Not every career requires completing all the steps.
- When exploring career options, it's important to consider how many steps they may be in the educational ladder.

EDUCATIONAL LADDER

- High School Diploma
 - This is the basic requirement for many entry-level jobs.
 - Shows completion of general education in subjects like math, science, English, and social studies.
 - Many careers start here, but additional education or training often leads to better opportunities.

EDUCATIONAL LADDER

- Certification

- An official document or credential that proves you have specific skills or knowledge in a particular field or job.
- Earned by passing a test or completing a training program
- Focuses on a specific skill or profession
- Offered by professional organizations, schools, or employers
- Can be required or recommended for certain jobs
- Usually takes less time than a college degree
- Certification Examples: Welding, Certified Nurses Assistant (CNA), **Serve-Safe, Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Access), CPR/First-Aid**

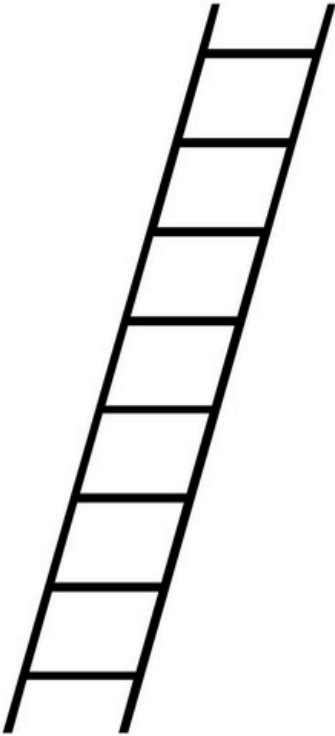


Career Ladder

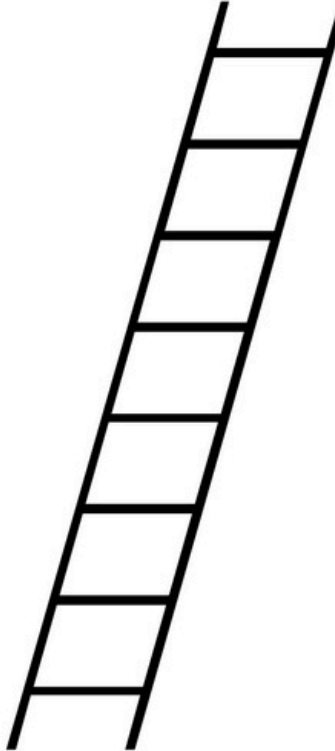

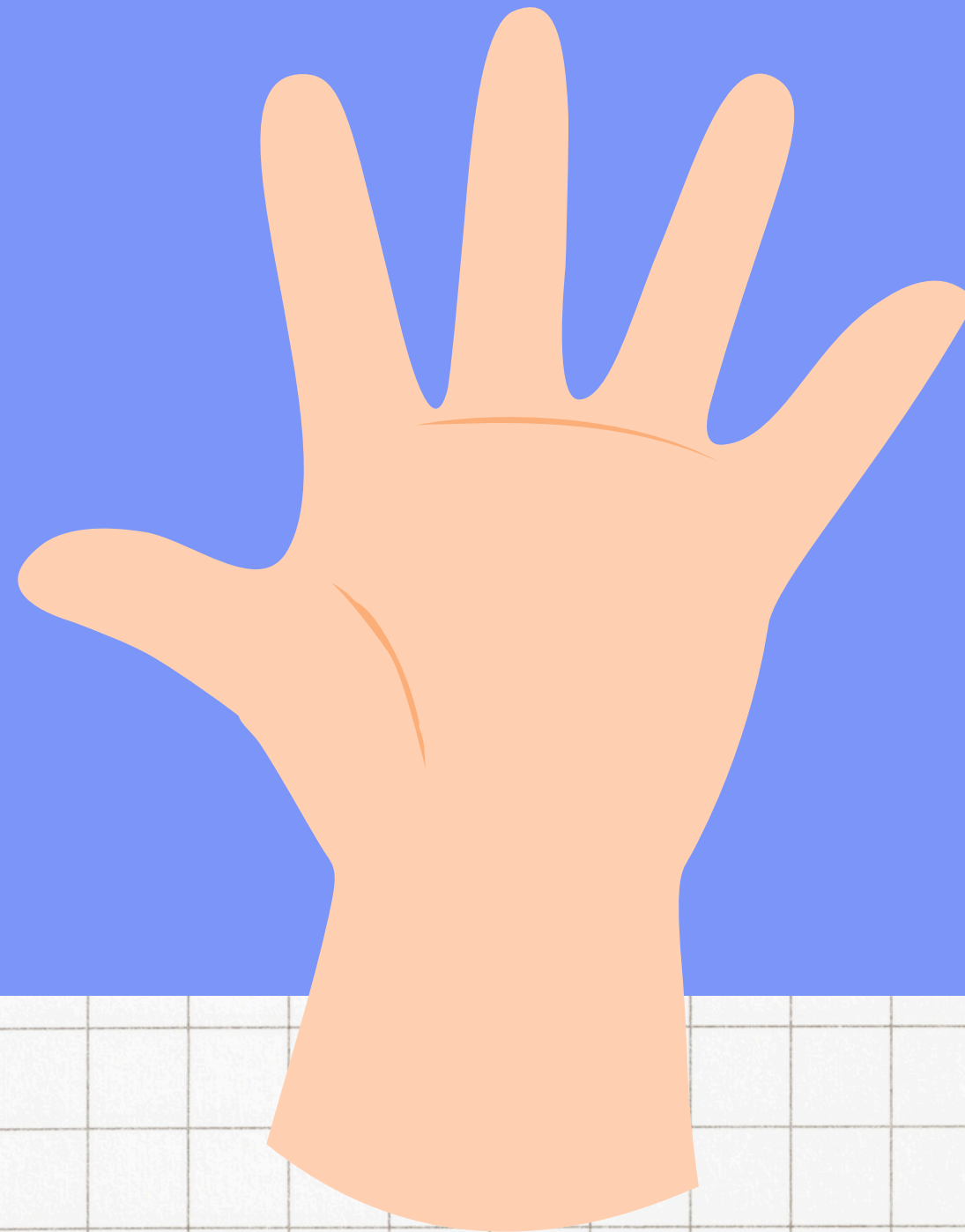
